This decision will enable the RIEs to attract talented students to the teaching profession. The 12thFive year plan: sub document on "Teacher Education" in page no. 45 under 5.10.6 advocated for instituting the scheme of scholarship (it is proposed to institute a Scheme for awarding scholarship to meritorious students to enrol in to the teacher education programmes. A beginning could be made in this direction from the academic year 2012-13 onwards by awarding a scholarship)

Percentage of Marks: The merit of the students (CEE merit and marks as per the guidelines from the Council from time to time) under each state category at the time of admission for 1st year would be considered. The second year they have to obtain minimum 60% of marks in aggregate of the two consecutive semesters of preceding year (average of two proceeding semesters will be calculated) or annual marks of the preceding year.

Duration of Scholarships: The duration of the scholarship is given in the following table:

Renewal: The renewal of scholarship for second year and subsequent years would be based on the criteria of the maintenance of minimum 60% of marks in aggregate of the two consecutive semesters of preceding year (the average of the two proceeding Semesters will be calculated) or annual marks of the preceding year.

Income Limit: The students whose parental/family income is upto Rs. 5 lakh per annum will be eligible for 100% amount of the rate of scholarship. The other students whose parental income is above Rs. 5 lakh per annum, will be paid 50% amount of the rate of scholarship. The students will have to submit the fresh income certificate every year, for award of

Attendance of students: For availing the scholarship the student should maintain the Scholarship. minimum 80% compulsory attendance in each Semester. The scholarship will be released after ensuring the minimum attendance as indicated.



- a. The Committee examined the comparative statements of scholarship vis-à-vis the revised scholarship rules and guidelines provided by the NCERT and considered the award of scholarship to the students of different classes admitted on state-wise and category-wise on merit for the session 2019-20.

- Subject to the provisions of clauses (a), (c) and (i) of sub-section (1), any information relating to any occurrence, event or matter which has taken place, occurred or happened twenty years before the date on which any request is made under section 6 shall be provided to any person making a request under that section:

Provided that where any question arises as to the date from which the said period of twenty years has to be computed, the decision of the Central Government shall be final, subject to the usual appeals provided for in this Act.

11. THIRD PARTY INFORMATION

(1) Where a Central Public Information Officer or a State Public Information Officer, as the case may be, intends to disclose any information or record, or part thereof on a request made under this Act, which relates to or has been supplied by a third party and has been treated as confidential by that third party, the Central Public Information Officer or State Public Information Officer, as the case may be, shall, within five days from the receipt of the request, give a written notice to such third party of the request and of the fact that the Central Public Information Officer or State Public Information Officer, as the case may be, intends to disclose the information or record, or part thereof. and invite the third party to make a submission in writing or orally, regarding whether the information should be disclosed, and such submission of the third party shall be kept in view while taking a decision about disclosure of information:


Provided that except in the case of trade or commercial secrets protected by law, disclosure may be allowed if the public interest in disclosure outweighs in importance any possible harm or injury to the interests of such third party

- (2) Where a notice is served by the Central Public Information Officer or State Public Information Officer, as the case may be, under sub-section (1) to a third party in respect of any information or record or part thereof, the third party shall, within ten days from the date of receipt of such notice, be given the opportunity to make representation against the proposed disclosure.
- (3) Notwithstanding anything contained in section 7, the Central Public Information Officer or State Public Information Officer, as the case may be, shall, within forty days after receipt of the request under section 6, if the third party has been given an opportunity to make representation under sub-section (2), make a decision as to whether or not to disclose the information or record or part thereof and give in writing the notice of his decision to the third party.
- (4) A notice given under sub-section (3) shall include a statement that the third party to whom the notice is given is entitled to prefer an appeal under section 19 against the decision



All students are hereby, informed that Ragging is Prohibited as per the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court of India and guidelines issued by UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Education Institutes 2009 (under Seec 26 (I) (g) of UGC Act 1956). Ragging is also prohibited and punishable under U.P. Prohibition of Ragging in Educational Institutions Act, 2010. Students have been given booklets containing Anti-Ragging guidelines and they are required to submit the Anti-Ragging Affidavits to this effect. Main circulars, in this regard have also been uploaded over the institute website. These, guidelines also contain various types of punishments to be meted out to the students indulging in ragging or other in-disciplinary activites.

Therefore, if any student is found involved or guily of ragging and or abetting ragging, actively or passively or being part of conspiracy to promote ragging in any form, or found involved in any other type of in-disciplinary activities, he/she shall be liable to be penalized depending upon the nature and gravity of the offense, as established. The possible punishments shall be any one or any combination of the following:

- 1. Expulsion from the Institute; or

- h) any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

- 7. UGC has notified 3rd Amendment in UGC Regulations on 29th June, 2016 to expand the definition of ragging
 - "3. (i) Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background."
- 8. Installation of CCTV cameras at vital points.

- 1. Regular interaction and counseling with the students to detect early signs of ragging and identification of trouble-triggers.



PREFACE

The early six years of childhood constitute the most significant period in life, because at this stage the foundations are laid for motor, sensory, cognitive, language, social and personality development. Early Childhood Care and Education (ECCE) is considered to be crucial intervention for providing an enabling and stimulating environment to the child to ensure a sound foundation for both lifelong learning and development. ECCE contributes significantly to improvement in enrolment, retention, participation and learning level of children in formal schooling. The need for meaningful ECCE programme has been emphasized in the National Policy on Education (1986) and Programme of Action (POA, 1992). The significance of ECCE has been confirmed in the National Plan of Action (2005) and the National Curriculum Framework (NCF), 2005 at national level and the Global Monitoring Report of UNESCO (2007) at international level. The NCF-2005 suggests that young children should be provided with care, opportunities and experiences that lead to all round development-physical, social, mental, emotional and school readiness. To provide ECCE of equitable quality to all children the NCF-2005 identifies five basic dimensions of quality to be addressed namely (i) developmentally appropriate curriculum (ii) trained and adequately rewarded teachers (iii) appropriate teacher child ratio (iv) Infrastructure supportive of children's needs and (v) encouraging style of supervision and monitoring. It also suggests to evolve appropriate norms and guidelines and to set in place a regulatory framework. The exemplars on ECCE has been developed by NCERT during 2015. The DM School serves as an experimental model school to tryout innovations in the field of school education. For the session 2020-21 the ECCE Center ran smoothly with the help of many people in the process starting from development and reinforcement of infrastructure, selection of teachers, selection and admission of students, training of teachers and staff and evaluation of feedback.

We are grateful to the, Director, NCERT, and the Principal,R.I.E Bhubaneswar Prof P. C. Agarwal for their unflinching support for this programme. We gratefully acknowledge the continued support and encouragement provided by Head,DEE, members of ECCE cell, Mr. Ghanashyam Patra and In-charge Primary Section. Our thanks are due to the teachers Ms. Suchitra Samal, Ms. Sonali Panda and all the parents for their continued support and encouragement in smooth organization of the programme during this pandemic. - Child development and learning are characterized by individual variation: No two
 children are same. Each child has an individual pattern and timing of growth and
 development as well as individual styles of learning. Children's personal, family
 experiences and cultural backgrounds also vary.
- Children's learning reflects a recurring spiral that begins in awareness, and moves to exploration, to inquiry, and finally, to application. Any new learning by children begins with awareness, which is generated from their experiences with objects, events, or people and ends with utilization, where children are able to use what they have learnt for multiple purposes and apply their learning to new situations. At this stage children start exploring the next level of information and the spiral continues.
- Children need to experience success more than failure to form a positive self-concept: The experiences should be planned in accordance with the maturational level of the children, such that they are challenging yet achievable, so as to promote self-confidence. When children have confidence in themselves, they do better. They are eager to try new and harder things; they gain new skills and become more confident and capable.
- Children develop holistically and benefit from integrated experiences and education:
 Learning and development of children takes place in totality. All the domains of
 development i.e. physical, motor, cognitive, language, socio-personal, emotional
 and creative and aesthetic appreciation are interrelated and take place
 simultaneously.

2. Objectives of the Programme

To develop model ECCE Center and developing infrastructure supportive to pre-school children

Methodology: For organization of the center, infrastructure supportive to children was developed. Students were admitted on the basis of random method and two contractual teachers were selected trough interview. They were oriented on transactional strategies and assessment of pre-school Children. Activities schedule, assessment profiles were developed through workshop mode and feedback was collected from parents, teachers and other personnel concerned. The details of the programme including reflections are presented below.

3. ECCE CENTER 2020-21

Selection of Students: The admission for the classes (Pre School - 1) lower pre-primary and (Pre School - 2) upper pre- primary were done through random selection as per rule.

50 Parents /guardians were present in the computer cell to witness the random selection. The details of the selected and wait list candidates of all categories for LPP. The lists of selected and waiting lists candidates were displayed on the school notice board on 25thSeptember, 2020 at 8.00 PM as per schedule. The admission was done accordingly. The list of the students those admitted in LPP (PS -1) and UPP (PS-2) are given in *Appendix A*.

Selection of Teachers:

During the session (2020-21) for organization of the ECCE Center two teachers for the posts on contractual basis were selected from last sessions merit list as fresh interview could not be held due to covid pandemic. Mrs. Suchitra Samal and Mrs. Sonali Panda were selected as teachers.

Programme Planning and Development of Activities out lines

Planning is an important part of creating and implementing the ECCE Curriculum. Since the ECCE Programme has to be framed and transacted keeping the specific developmental objectives in mind. The long term developmental objectives were spelt out towards which the programme is geared and materials /activities to be used to meet these objectives. The Position Paper, National Focus Group on ECCE, 2005 developed by NCERT suggested the following basic tenets of curriculum development for ECCE:

- Based on needs and capacities of young children
- Recognition of special features of children's thinking
- Mix of formal and informal interaction
- Familiarity and challenge in everyday rhythm
- Primacy of experience rather than expertise
- Developmentally appropriate practice and flexibility
- Use of local material, arts and knowledge which reflect the diversity and culture of the children.

The team members in a workshop mode developed the month wise – week wise action plan for ECCE center for 2020-21. Starting from the September 2020 to March 2021 the developmentally appropriate practices were implemented. A month wise – week wise action plan describing specific activities for physical development, language development, socio-emotional development, cognitive development and pre-writing skills was developed keeping in mind the developmental characteristics of the children at this stage. The Action Plan depicting detailed activities is presented in *Appendix-B*.

Development of Profile: Since ECCE in essence is development oriented and not syllabus oriented, continuous informal evaluation of child in terms of developmental objectives is absolutely essential. Assessment is an essential and integral component of any ECCE programs to ensure that the programs remains child centric and the experiences and activities are planned according to the level of the child. It gives an insight into children's interests, achievements and possible difficulties in their learning from which next steps in learning and teaching can be planned and it thereby provides a platform to support the planning of a coherent curriculum for

progression in learning. In order to ensure that the programme is responsive to the developmental needs of the each child, it is essential to maintain their developmental and learning profile.

The purpose of assessment is to give useful information about child's learning and development to the adults involved with the programme and also to children and their families. It also helps ensure early identification of developmental delays, special educational needs and abilities. Assessment contributes to evaluation, revision, and development of programs.

For assessing and reporting assessment of pre-school students DEVELOPMENT PROFILE was developed in-house depicting developmental characteristics of students. The profile covers Creative development, Aesthetic skill development, Social development, Emotional development, Physical development, Language development and Cognitive development. Some of the skills/abilities/activities on each domain were listed in the profile and assessment of child continuously was done on continuous basis. The detail of the development is presented in *Appendix-C*.

Orientation of Teachers: Teachers in an ECCE programme are facilitators who engage children in multiple experiences to foster their all-round development. The early years of children constitute the most significant period in life, because it is this when the foundations are laid for motor, sensory, cognitive, social and personal development. A two-day orientation of teachers was held during September 2020. In addition to the orientation at R.I.E Bhubaneswar, the teachers, attendants and parents were oriented on different themes like: Significance of early childhood care and education, NCF-2005 and ECCE, Programme planning for ECCE, Strategies for ECCE, Early identification of children with special needs and Assessment of pre-school students/children. The team was oriented on the following roles of ECCE Teachers to:

- Observe children to identify their needs and capabilities and move with the pace of the each child's development
- Plan developmentally appropriate, holistic and challenging activities
- Focus not only on planning and conducting activities but also on continuous processes for interaction and relating learning to child's environment.
- Create nurturing and positive relationships with children and among children
- Organise supportive learning environment by taking care of aspects such as the arrangement of the physical environment and equipment; the scheduling of activities and events and groupings
- Work in partnership with parents
- Facilitate learning to meet the objectives of the curriculum
- Help in early identification and intervention for children with special needs

School- Community Interaction: Meeting with Parents: If child is the first priority in early childhood programme, parents are the second priority. Parents are the child's first teachers and continue to have the primary responsibility for their child's development. Parents, teachers and

school therefore function together as partners to help the child learn and grow. The young child spends most of the time at home and much of the early learning occurs through the child's day to day interactions with the family. The parents have a major role to play in the child's development, much beyond merely being around the child and providing food and other basic needs. Parents need to:

- Provide a conducive environment at home for optimal development and learning and spend quality time with the child
- Encourage exploration and experimentation at home and optimally utilize the ample opportunities for incidental and lifelong learning arising from the daily activities
- Play a cooperative role and establish a relationship of trust and mutual respect with the teacher/caregiver at the ECCE centre
- Share and plan the development of their child along with the teacher/caregiver
- Participate in the open days and other events for parents and community
- Not to force formal learning and competition at this early age and respect child abilities and personality.

Working with parents in an early childhood education programme includes two aspects-parental involvement and parent education. During the session apart from incidental meetings and discussions when parents come to leave or pick their children organized and formal meetings were held. During the session three formal PTM meetings were held. During meeting parents, teachers and team members participated.

4.1 ORGANISATION OF ECCE ACTIVITIES (PS-I)

During the session 2020-21, the activities were carried out as per schedule. The activities were mix of indoor and outdoor, free and guided activities. Theme wise physical, language, cognitive, socio-emotional activities were organized. The details of the activities and schedule are appended in 'Appendix-B'.

Physical Development Activities: Physical activities according to the related themes were done by kids and respective videos were forwaded by parents to the teachers for observation and guidance.

Language Development Activities: During the theme ME & MY FRIENDS. The activities included encourage children to tell their name, share what they do, their favorite food, colour, shapes, seasons, clothes, feelings & relationship with others. Encourage them to describe their friends appearance during circle time, look around the class room & say five things they see etc. Rhymes like (English rhymes). I am Special", "All by myself" Story "True friend", For the theme "MY BODY" discussion on Who has taken bath in the morning ,how do they feel before & after a bath, do they use soap, what did they eat in the morning ,how many times they brush their teeth

,how do they eat food, how do they clap, which part of their body they use for running, what we do with our eyes, how do we keep our eyes cleaned. Rhymes "My little nose,knees", "Two little eyes" The actions I can do". For the theme MY FAMILY discussion about family members, ways to help their family, encourage each child to say something about each family member that they have drawn, importance of family(joint & nuclear), various activities families do together, kind of food their family eat, portraying the character of any family member, etc. Rhymes "Family" Daadi chali school" & Story "Pyare papa", "For theme "MY ANIMALS" discussion on pet animals where do they live name and identify, farm animals what do they give and where do they live, difference between farm and jungle animals, discussion on water animals and birds, Rhymes-"Puppy dog", Bandar mama", Elly the Elephant. For theme AIR discussion on importance of air ,how they can feel air, things that can travel on air, how seeds get carried away by the wind, what they observe on windy days, talk about air transport, encourage them to find out the things that are moving on air during nature walk, how wind can move things, other machines that move air, we can feel air& can't see it, effects of moving air ,encourage children to think & talk about the objects they can see moving in the air. Rhymes like " "Patang" and "Preety Balloons". For theme WATER, discussion on sources, uses, 3 forms-ice, water, steam, importance of water. Rhymes-" Rain and Water"". For theme 'PLANTS AND TREES" discussion on important, uses, parts, needs, types,& how to take care of plants & trees. Encourage children to create & tell a story on plants & tress .Stories like "Fruits of hard work are always sweet", are told by using audio-visual system. Rhymes like. "Aam and Vegetables rhymes" was also told, For theme 'TRANSPORT" discussion on road, water and air transport where do they move, identify and name them, importance of traffic signal, zebra crossing, Rhymes "Traffic Lights and Mr.Bus was told and Story "The boat ride", "Remote control plane",". For the theme COMMUNITY HELPERS". Rhyme, "The Doctor" and Daakiya" rhymes were told.

Cognitive Development Activities: For theme ME & MY FRIENDS. The activities included shape concept: circular, matching photo, shapes& colours, identification of big and small, more less, tall and short, sound discrimination, one-to-one correspondence ,tasting, touch & fell, counting, find the similar one, how many, measure the hand,etc. During theme MY BODY. The activities included Sense of taste, hear, smell, touch, vision, sequential, matching, music jinglers, identification of sound loud and soft, colour dominoes, how I have grown, imitate, let's measure, follow the direction, children's height chart etc. During theme MY FAMILY. The activities included was family photo pasting, matching family photos, join the dots to form square, tracing horizontal lines, vertical lines, match the motor, sortingclothing, finding similarities and differences(alphabets), alphabets sensory play, match who is missing(find the partner) ,household sounds, who am I, match the mother, sorting clothing ,pictures&socks,block building, family puzzle, tall &short etc.seriation my family's day and for November the theme was our helpers. Children did matching flash cards of community helpers with real tools. Cognitive development activities were organized as per themes and developmental characteristics of children. During theme MY ANIMALS.. Activities were included like wool, cotton, sand pasting, sponge dabbing, diyadecoration, ice cream sticks pasting and seriation cards smallest to

biggest, draw dots according to the given numbers, match the body parts of different animals and Patterns etc .During theme AIR. Activities included like tracing slanting lines, brush painting, cotton, newspaper pasting, and match with relationship. During theme WATER blow bubbles, water tasting, sponge play, cotton pasting. During the theme PLANTS & TREES. Activities were included like ,ice cream sticks pasting, sorting leaves, sponge dabbing, fruit printing, sponge, sand, wool and thermocol pastings. During the theme TRANSPORT activities like transportation counting, count and match, match the number with pictures, transport dominoes matching, During theme COMMUNITY HELPERS. Children did matching flash cards of community helpers with real tools, sorting of tools etc, pre-number concept etc.

Socio-emotional Development Activities: During theme 'ME & MY FRIEND. The activities included thank you and welcome, wishing teachers and parents and how to say Namaste. During theme MY BODY. The activities included importance of Raksha Bandhan & Janamastami and waiting for turn .Different stories were narrated for socio-emotional development of children. During theme MY FAMILY activities included stories on family.. During the theme MY ANIMALS. Activities were included like celebration of Navaratri & Dusshera.During theme AIR. For socio- emotional development activities focused on celebration of Diwali & Laxmi puja.

During theme WATER. Activities were taken like Christmas day celebration and kids did colorful greetings and enjoyed. During theme PLANTS &TREES. Activities were taken importance of Republic day & narrate stories on freedom fighters and kids did colorful greetings and enjoyed. During theme TRANSPORT .During theme COMMUNITY HELPERS.

Readiness activities and Aesthetic skills: At early stage, the young child may not be ready for the guided instruction. Readiness is the state of receptiveness and ability to be receptive. During the session reading, writing and number readiness activities were planned and organized. During July, 2019 pre-writing skills like art-free hand colouring and holding cylindrical blocks was organized. During the session the readiness activities included were number rods, tracing of sandpaper, letters and numbers writing pattern slanting, half circle and full circle, tracing sand paper letters were focused and created interest among children. Similarly some of the activities during the session for aesthetic development of children included finger printing, vegetable printing, butterfly art by pressing, tear and pasting, Christmas tree, Santa clause, leaf printing, finger printing, sand pasting, cotton pasting, sponge dabbing, thermocol pasting & match stick pasting. Following photographs shows the readiness activities and aesthetic activities of children.

4.2 ORGANISATION OF ECCE ACTIVITIES-(PS-II)

During the session 2020-21 the activities were carried out as per schedule. The activities were mix of indoor and outdoor, free and guided activities. Theme wise physical, language, cognitive, socio-emotional activities were organized. The details of the activities and schedule are appended in 'Appendix-B'.

(Hindi) & Story "Nani ka chasma", "Phuli Roti". For theme "MY ANIMALS" discussion on pet animals where do they live name and identify, farm animals what do they give and where do they live, difference between farm and jungle animals, discussion on water animals and birds, Rhymes-"Billi", "Koyal", "Titli", (Hindi), & Story "Tota, "Saath Chidiya", "Chilbil Silbil". The For theme AIR discussion on importance of air ,how they can feel air, things that can travel on air, how seeds get carried away by the wind, what they observe on windy days, talk about air transport, encourage them to find out the things that are moving on air during nature walk, how wind can move things, other machines that move air, we can feel air& can't see it, effects of moving air ,encourage children to think & talk about the objects they can see moving in the air. Rhymes like "In the sky" (English), "Patang," (Hindi) were taught, and story "Hamari Patang". For theme WATER, discussion on sources, uses, 3 forms-ice, water, steam, importance of water. For theme 'TRANSPORT" discussion on road, water and air transport where do they move, identify and name them, importance of traffic signal, zebra crossing, Rhymes "Go,Go,Go", "Traffic Light" was told and Story "Mili ki cycle". For the theme COMMUNITY HELPERS". Activities focused on socio-emotional development children visited temple, post office, bank and dispensary. Rhyme, "Community Helpers", (English) "Holi".


Feedback and Suggestions-

BRIEF REPORT OF THE TRAINING PROGRAMME

Planning of the Programme

The programme was conducted on the basis of the request of the state of Bihar. A planning group meeting was conducted and a need assessment tool was developed and sent to SCERT, Bihar for collecting the need of the training area on school readiness.

Conduction of the Programme

The day was divided into two parts .The first session in the morning (10.50 am to 11.30 am) was the inaugural session which was addressed by Prof. M K Satapathy, Dean of Instructions, Dr. S. P Mishra, Head, Department of Education and State Coordinator of Bihar, Dr. S K Dash, Head Department of Extension Education, and Prof. B N Panda, Senior faculty of Department of Education.

Inaugural session



Dr. I .P. Gowramma welcomed the resource persons and threw light on the objectives of the programme. The participants introduced themselves and expressed their expectations from the five days training. Introduction of the participant initiated by Dr. Gowramma their name and specialization and expectation from the programme.



Dr. S P Mishra highlighted the background and need of the programme. The programme is organised since the scenario of elementary and secondary education is grim and focus is needed on school preparedness, at national level. A meaningful training should be given to teachers. He requested to give practical solution which can be applied at grassroots level. Talked about pre-school and how to be prepared for school.





Prof S K Dash talked about the conception of in service training programme. He discussed the importance of the school readiness since 6-8 age group is very crucial for development it is the time when foundation of all round development of a child is laid. He briefed the participants how the programme was developed over the time span the contributions along with this he emphasized on the discussion and open participation and ideas. He also briefed about activities which will be carried out from 8-12th of Dec. Dr. S K Dash gave talk on training process of programme. He gave details of the process of the programme. He focused on Joyful learning of children, all need to be very openminded, very particular, potential systematic.

Principal in charge Prof M K Satpathy discussed important ideas related to readiness and schemes adopted by GOVT. of Odisha. Sir shared his life experience with participants. He spoke some very serious and genuine problems like working parents; early admission in the playschool, crèches has bad effect on child development. The innovative idea needed to change the scenario. He also threw light on the "SHISHU CLASS" an initiative of Orissa Government.



Participants introduced themselves one by one and gave brief understanding of their views on the programme and shared their experiences in field of education. The experts highlighted the need for school readiness and activities that will be initiated in the upcoming four days. They encouraged the participants to actively participate in the session. The need to increase expository and communication skills along with reading, writing and arithmetic readiness was emphasized. "Shishu class" an initiative of Orissa government was focused on as one of the innovative initiatives taken and to be adopted.

Dr.P.K Tripathy addressed the gathering. He emphasized on automatic learning of child in a congenial environment and inclusive settings. He moved on to empowerment and emphasized a women empowerment and role of a mother in early childhood care of children and its essence in growing up. He summarized the many national policies and reports that focused an accessible technology, quality, equity, excellence and multi engagement of a child in classroom.



Beginning of the training programme



Dr.P K Tripathy gave presentation on promoting excellence in ECCE at the preschool level. He encouraged the participants to be active and interact he also threw light on how school threw light on how school readiness is important to initiate school readiness because it is the key towards meaningful learning. Listen, speaking, reading and writing skill, Skills of English and the new skills of expository and communicative skills were also focused. It was Original interpretation of his on thinking. To promote excellence in ECCE three things are necessary Quality –productivity-outcome. Excellence in structure, Involvement, childhood, unseen feeling, environment-Stimuli (intra cellular & inter cellular). Focused on understand the biology of a student. Attitude towards children should be soft and sympathetic. Don't expect anything from child; expectation should be there from adults.

Prof.B .N Panda gave an orientation to students on early literacy. He focused on development of language competencies as one of the most essential components of early childhood. Participatory and visual learning, collaborative and cooperative learning and innovation whether learning as the key factor of this delivery.

The expectations of the participants from the program were also documented. They feel that learning in change should be revolutionized from the school itself. The techniques to introduce actively based program, play-way to be increased. One should stop unnecessarily burdening the child with role material.

Prof.B N Panda focused on the problems and challenges faced by education in India. The importance of the programme and the activities that will be carried out throughout the programme. He shared his views on school readiness. Role of teacher, curriculum, training programme, environment, less waitage and dropouts, 18% students' dropout in Bihar, Oral listening carefully. Needed a educated mother, love for child, environmental education, RTE, Sishu, Preschool programme.

Reflection of participants from 08.12.2016 to 11.12.2016

Day 1-The first day of the five days' workshop on ECCE started with the registration of the participants. It was followed by the inaugural speeches by the principal RIE, Head DEE, Head DEHM, DMS and some other team members. The participants also introduced themselves. After the introduction session Dr. Prabin Kumar Tripathy shared his valuable opinion on promoting excellence in early childhood care and education. He discussed on background things, contents and policy. He focused on the fact that children are born in potential as strong and powerful human beings. He also suggested that in the early childhood, care of a child is more important than the education of a child. He also discussed some of the major existing issues and also suggested some best practices for ECCE. To sum up this session, i may say that the opinion and suggestion given by him are of great value for us, i.e the key resource persons on school readiness.

The second session was on ECCE in Bihar and this session was conducted by Dr. Gowramma, Dr Laxmidhar Behera and Dr. Dhanya Krishnan.



This session focused on sharing of experiences, evidences and expectations. We the resource persons shared our experiences regarding ECCE and then as evidence the video clip on 'Chahak' made by SCERT Patna was shown. After this presentation we shared our expectations from this workshop and from RIE Bhubaneswar. And hope we get maximum support and guidance in this regard RIE, Bhubaneswar, so that we may be able to make the ECCE programme a great success in Bihar. The session continued with a discussion on school readiness perspective in ECCE policy and curriculum framework-2013. The team explained the points by giving examples from the day to day practical life which made the topic easily understandable. They emphasized on the maximum involvement of the children. We enjoyed the discussion very much highly benefit with not

only the wise and lively discussions with so great dignitaries but also with the warm are affectionate nature of each and every member and staff of RIE Bhubaneswar.

- Child development and learning are characterized by individual variation: No two
 children are same. Each child has an individual pattern and timing of growth and
 development as well as individual styles of learning. Children's personal, family
 experiences and cultural backgrounds also vary.
- Children's learning reflects a recurring spiral that begins in awareness, and moves to exploration, to inquiry, and finally, to application. Any new learning by children begins with awareness, which is generated from their experiences with objects, events, or people and ends with utilization, where children are able to use what they have learnt for multiple purposes and apply their learning to new situations. At this stage children start exploring the next level of information and the spiral continues.
- Children need to experience success more than failure to form a positive self-concept: The experiences should be planned in accordance with the maturational level of the children, such that they are challenging yet achievable, so as to promote self-confidence. When children have confidence in themselves, they do better. They are eager to try new and harder things; they gain new skills and become more confident and capable.
- Children develop holistically and benefit from integrated experiences and
 education: Learning and development of children takes place in totality. All the
 domains of development i.e. physical, motor, cognitive, language, socio-personal,
 emotional and creative and aesthetic appreciation are interrelated and take place
 simultaneously.

2. OBJECTIVES OF THE PROGRAMME

To develop model ECCE Center and developing infrastructure supportive to pre-school children

Methodology: For organization of the center, infrastructure supportive to children was developed. Students were admitted on the basis of random method and two contractual teachers were selected trough interview. They were oriented on transactional strategies and assessment of pre-school Children. Activities schedule, assessment profiles were developed through workshop mode and feedback was collected from parents, teachers and other personnel concerned. The details of the programme including reflections are presented below.

The lists of selected and waiting lists candidates were displayed on the school notice board on 23 July 2021 at 11.30 AM as per schedule. The admission was done accordingly. The list of the students those admitted in LPP(PS-1) and UPP (PS-2) are given in *Appendix*. A.

Selection of Teachers:

For organization of the ECCE Center an interview for the teachers and attendants was conducted on 16.09.2021. For this advertisement was made and only eligible candidates appeared in the interview. The committee chaired by the Principal selected two teachers for the posts on contractual basis for the session 2021 -22. Mrs. Laxmipriya Ojha and Mrs. Sonali Panda were selected as teachers.

Programme Planning and Development of Activities out lines

Planning is an important part of creating and implementing the ECCE Curriculum. Since the ECCE Programme has to be framed and transacted keeping the specific developmental objectives in mind. The long term developmental objectives were spelt out towards which the programme is geared and materials /activities to be used to meet these objectives. The Position Paper, National Focus Group on ECCE, 2005 developed by NCERT suggested the following basic tenets of curriculum development for ECCE:

- Based on needs and capacities of young children
- Recognition of special features of children's thinking
- Mix of formal and informal interaction
- Familiarity and challenge in everyday rhythm
- Primacy of experience rather than expertise
- Developmentally appropriate practice and flexibility
- Use of local material, arts and knowledge which reflect the diversity and culture of the children.

The team members in a workshop mode developed the month wise – week wise action plan for ECCE center for 2021-22. Starting from the October 2021 to March 2022. A month wise – week wise action plan describing specific activities for physical development, language development, socio-emotional development, cognitive development and pre-writing skills was developed keeping in mind the developmental characteristics of the children at this stage. The Action Plan depicting detailed activities is presented in *Appendix-B*.

Development of Profile: Since ECCE in essence is development oriented and not syllabus oriented, continuous informal evaluation of child in terms of developmental objectives is absolutely essential. Assessment is an essential and integral component of any ECCE programs to ensure that the programs remains child centric and the experiences and activities are planned according to the level of the child. It gives an insight into children's interests, achievements and possible difficulties in their learning from which next steps in learning and teaching can be planned and it thereby provides a platform to support the planning of a coherent curriculum for progression in learning. In order to ensure that the programme is responsive to the developmental needs of the each child, it is essential to maintain their developmental and learning profile.

The purpose of assessment is to give useful information about child's learning and development to the adults involved with the programme and also to children and their families. It also helps ensure early identification of developmental delays, special educational needs and abilities. Assessment contributes to evaluation, revision, and development of programs.

2. 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Action Taken Report on Purchase Committee recommendation

The duly Constituted purchase Committee has recommended the items to be purchased in the meeting held on 28.10.2020 as per the budget allocation during 2020-21 under both Capital and Revenue head of Equipment and Furniture 2020-21.
